

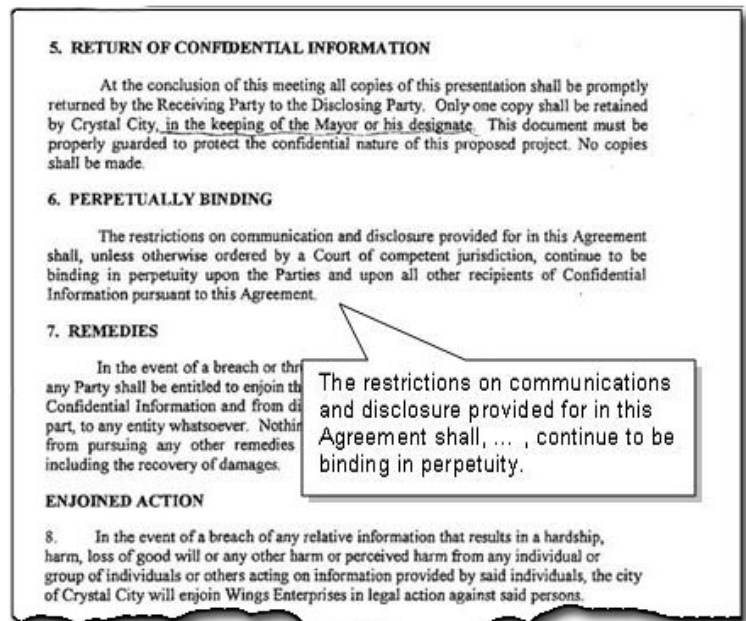

What is Trust?

WHEN IT APPLIES TO ELECTED OFFICIALS TRUST IS BEING OPEN AND OBJECTIVE

- Trustworthy elected officials never sign “**secrecy agreements**” when the public’s business is involved. Trustworthy people do not hide information from the citizens they represent.
- Trustworthy officials should never vote to rezone someone’s property without giving ample notification to the owner of the property. Our constitution guarantees private property rights and they are a safeguard of our liberty. Sneaking through massive rezoning of our city is **not a trustworthy act**.
- Trustworthy officials should never vote to allow city employees to use taxpayer money to pay for personal expenses. Your taxes are for city services only, **not for private use**. To do otherwise is not trustworthy.
- Trustworthy officials should protect those they represent and not side with outside developers based on **verbal promises** especially when the developer has **NO track record**.
- Trustworthy officials must be independent in order to diligently adopt any and all recommendations that will be forthcoming from our state auditor in order to make our city government more open, responsive, transparent and efficient. We need **open minds** that can take an **objective look**.
- Trustworthy officials will be unafraid to stand up when the smelter developer asks to weaken the restrictions placed on his permit and **say no**.
- We need more elected officials who are NOT related to city employees, people who can make independent, informed decisions. It’s time to clean up our city government. **It’s time to TRUST again**.
- We need **fresh voices** on our city council, not more of the same that has divided our city. It’s time to **stand up** and be heard. It’s time to make sure your government is **open**. It’s time to **stop the secrecy** and sneakiness. It’s time to stop spending your tax money for personal bills and it’s time for our city government to be accountable.
